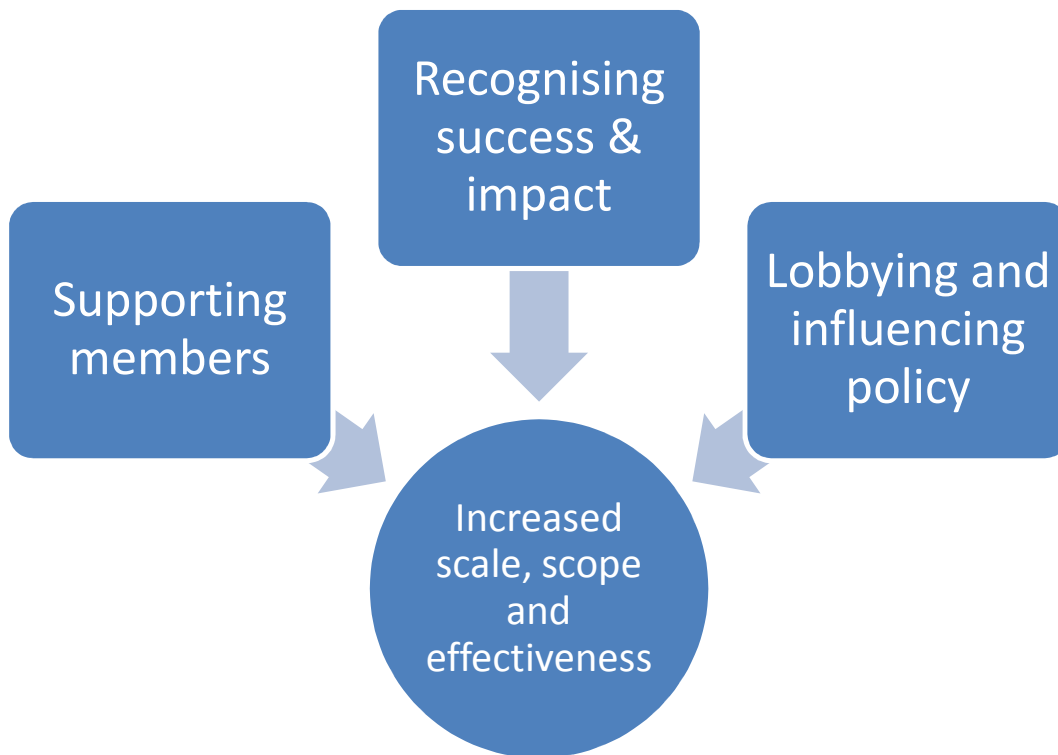


Enterprise Educators UK is the national network for enterprise educators. We are a not-for-profit membership organisation and our purpose is simple – to support our members to increase the scale, scope and effectiveness of enterprise and entrepreneurship education within their organisations.



So, how does it work?

Membership is on an organisational basis. Once your organisation has joined we keep in email contact with one main primary contact and as many secondary contacts as you wish to name. Everyone employed by your organisation is eligible to benefit from membership. What's more, if you want to get more involved then you can always be nominated to join the Board and help to shape an organisation that is run by its members, for its members.

What does it cost?

Annual organisational membership runs from 1st August and the fee is just £500 for the academic year. For this single fee all staff are eligible to benefit from the membership offer which is detailed on the next page.

- Online case studies highlight the impact of members' work
- Regular newsletters featuring member news
- Presenting at/hosting BP events – your chance to share your expertise with others
- National Enterprise Educator Awards (with NCEE) – recognising the crucial role of educators and champions
- IEEC opportunities to present – parallel practitioner focussed sessions are designed with EEUK members in mind

We lobby and work hard to influence policy

- Our Directors are in regular contact with national governments, devolved administrations and departments such as BIS
- We represent our members and stress the impact of their work, for example we are active participants in the Quality Assurance Agency's Graduate Enterprise and Entrepreneurship Group
- We play an important role on an international stage, for example working with the United Nations to develop an international policy toolkit for entrepreneurship
